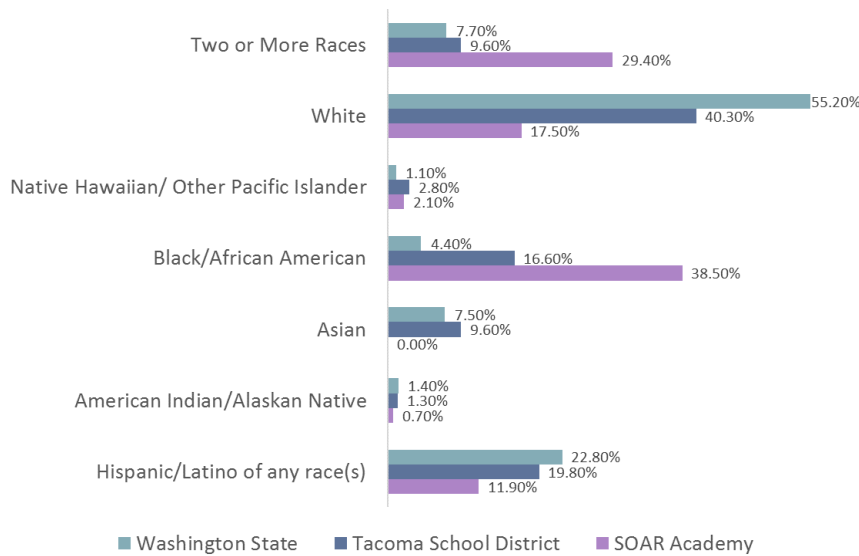

Daily attendance was affected by a higher than expected enrollment of students experiencing housing insecurity, and a number of students who moved and were not formally dis-enrolled. A new Dean of Students will oversee school/home connections in the 17-18 school year.

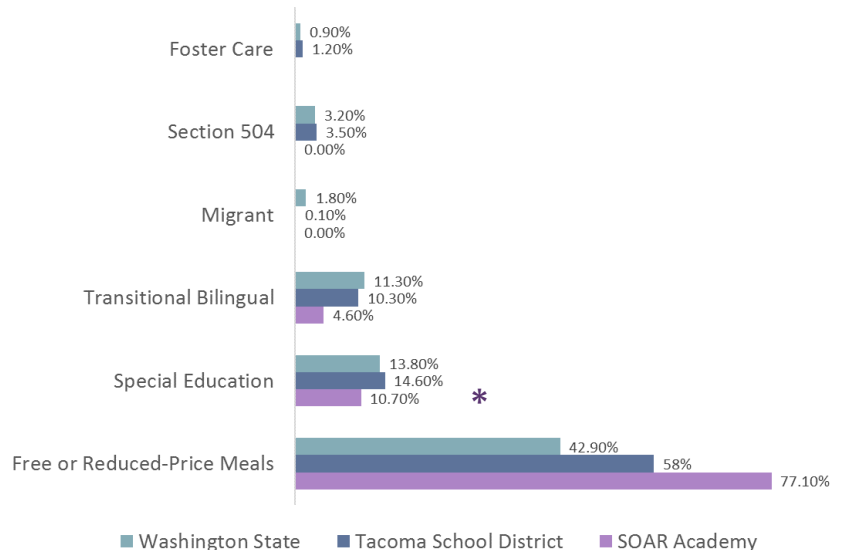

*Special Education

During the 2016-2017 school year, SOAR Academy served grades K-2. Due to the young age of entry into the educational system, many students were still in the child find process, and had not been evaluated when initial numbers were reported. By year end, the percentage of students who qualified for special education services grew to **14.2%**.

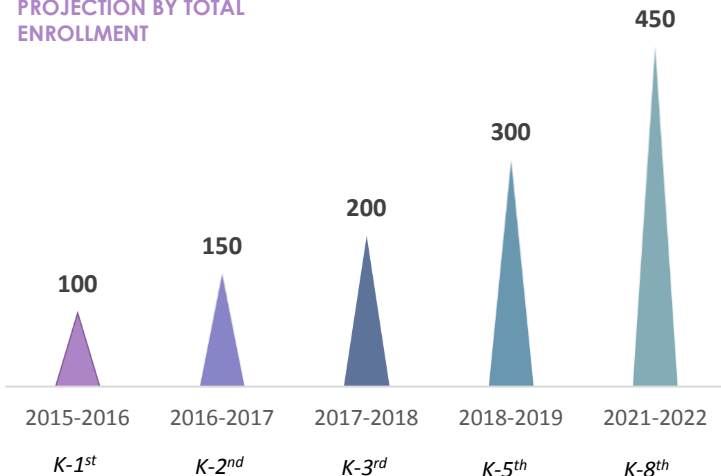
INDIVIDUAL AND COMMUNITY: We value our individuality, diverse perspectives and the power of community.

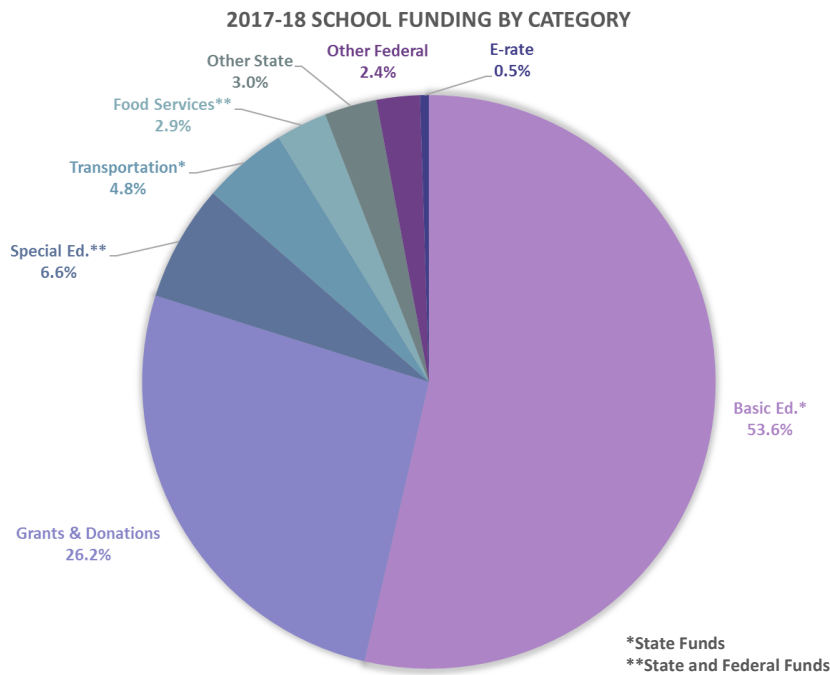
SOAR ACADEMY GROWTH PROJECTION BY TOTAL ENROLLMENT

Community Input

In March 2017, SOAR Academy sent a survey to the SOAR parent community to gather responses on various items including, academics, arts, building/facility use, school growth, reasons for choosing SOAR Academy, reasons for keeping child at SOAR Academy, and suggested school improvements.

There were 33 respondents to the survey. Most responses were qualitative rather than quantitative, and provided valuable information for school leaders to make decisions on future growth, facility use, social emotional and behavioral development, and academics.

Parents and the school community are considered critical thought partners to SOAR Academy. Community input is essential in building a strong, inclusive, and welcoming environment, as well as in providing continual school improvements and student success. All parents, neighbors, friends, and community members are welcome to get involved, by providing input, visiting the school, and/or talking to the School Leader, teachers, staff, and school board, to help shape the future success of SOAR Academy.

School Building

SOAR Academy currently occupies a single school building in Tacoma’s hilltop neighborhood. Over the past two years, SOAR has made significant capital improvements to the building’s interior, including a remodeled library space, remodeled special use areas, and reconfigured staff office areas. SOAR Academy is an occupied, leased, school building. It is not a designated historic structure. SOAR Academy’s substructure, shell, interiors, services, and furnishings are all in good condition.
